Learner G has really focused on his education and has seen it make a massive difference to his own life.

He had never been to school so when he came into prison, he was unable to read or write. He didn't even know what his own name looked like and needed help from other prisoners to fill in forms, often being teased and ridiculed for his lack of education. He was unable to speak to his family for six months as he couldn't fill in the form to get visits or access phone calls.

Another prisoner and family friend referred him to the Shannon Trust where he started learning how to read and write; he kept practicing daily on his own until he was allowed up to education in October 2021. G has gone on to do courses in maths, English, Art and Design, Music technology, financial awareness, cleaning courses, and IT courses, including one at Level 3. He is now waiting to do a business course.

He is using those skills to help others who are starting from a similar position to his own. He has been motivated from the very beginning to work hard to better himself and make his family proud of him. The growth and confidence his tutors have seen since starting Level 1 English is phenomenal and we are all so proud of his achievements and the fact that he is always striving to do more. He has further continued his education by completing and achieving Level 2 English and peer mentoring and is now a Shannon Trust mentor supporting learners in a similar position to him when he started to read. Massive well done!
