Welcome to our third annual Community Impact Report.

This year, our mission to Deliver Fairer Futures has been widely recognised. When Ofsted inspectors visited in February 2024, Milton Keynes College was once again rated as Good and our work with Adult Learners and those with High Needs was rated as Outstanding.

The report made special mention of our expertise in meeting the skills needs of our local businesses and stakeholders, the standard of teaching and learning, the College's links to employers and the careers guidance and support provided. This report is so encouraging, as the inspectors saw us doing exactly what we promise, providing Fairer Futures for our learners.

The College Group was awarded the MKBAA Award for 'Business Impact in the Community' in March this year. The judges said, "the breadth of engagement through the college's partnerships and stakeholder engagement activities clearly demonstrated the impact and influence the organisation has had within the Milton Keynes community".

I couldn't have said it better myself!

Lots of exciting things have happened across the College Group this year. Our South Central Institute of Technology (SCIoT) building in Bletchley fully opened to students in September 2023, offering state-of-the-art facilities and real-world projects with global tech brands, led by expert tutors. The SCIoT has also hosted community events including holiday activity clubs and our 'Demystifying AI' event in March for the local business community.

Our prison education network has also been growing. The 10 additional prisons in Kent, Surrey and Sussex and the new HMP Fosse Way, which opened last spring, mean that we can support even more learners to have better futures.

Our journey to embed equality, diversity and fairness continues. Our second cohort of Student Commissioners for Racial Justice are doing important work to raise awareness of the vital topic of racial justice and our employee networks have built strong relationships with local groups such as Man Cave and Q:Alliance. We're also strengthening

our relationships with Women Leaders UK, MK Community Foundation, the High Sheriff of Buckinghamshire and MK Ethnic Business Community.

Supporting our local communities remains central to our Fairer Futures Strategy. We recently held a Hustings event where learners put their questions to electoral candidates from all four major parties and voted for their preferred candidate. We held our second annual College in the Community Day, where more than 900 learners and colleagues volunteered for more than 40 vital community projects and had fantastic experiences which they can build into their learning to better understand their local communities.

I'd like to say a huge thank you to the colleagues, learners, employers and partners who made all of this happen. By working together, we can deliver Fairer Futures to our communities, and I am excited to see what the future holds.

Aim One

We drive aspirational, innovative and student-focussed educational experiences that have a positive impact on social mobility.

Building aspiration in our students is key to their ongoing success, igniting a spark that can propel them forwards in their future careers. Key to this is ensuring that students are equipped to learn effectively by building core skills of confidence, resilience, as well as strong English and maths. This is particularly important where students have had a challenging time at school. In September 2023 we launched our 'Skills Academy', to build these key skills and competencies. The programme was incredibly popular with students and their parents, and we look forward to our first cohort of learners moving onto vocational specialisms within the College.

We are proud of our prison education business. MK College Group delivers education in 30 prisons throughout England including the entire long-term, high security estate and the brand-new Fosse Way private prison in Leicester. This year our prison work grew as we were entrusted with the Kent, Surrey and Sussex prison contract in Southeast England.

== Aim One

One of the areas highlighted as 'Outstanding' in our recent Ofsted report, was provision for students with High Needs.

The report recognised that students with High Needs "enjoy being at College. They feel supported and valued by their teachers and by each other. They form sound friendships and know to whom they should speak if they have any worries or concerns," and that these students "make rapid and sustained progress with their academic, vocational and personal learning."

Becca Partridge, Head of School for ESOL and Inclusive Learning, spoke about her pride in her team and the hard work that goes into being rated as Outstanding.

Becca said, "I think the thing that impressed the inspectors most was the sense of teamwork shown by all staff. The inspection allowed us to show off all the fantastic things we do in addition to the learners' main study programme, including our Horticulture Centre, Inclusively Yours shop, and partnership working with organisations such as Woughton Community Council."

This year has seen our aim of using partnerships to support employers tested to the max. Ofsted spent two days speaking to a selection of our employer customers, as well as our local council and other bodies representing employers to see how strong we are at responding to skills needs.

The result couldn't have been more positive. In their rating of MK College as 'Strong' for skills, the highest category available, Ofsted commented; "Senior leaders work very effectively in partnership with numerous stakeholders to identify, understand and contribute to meeting skills needs in the city, region and nationally... Leaders and managers use these excellent partnerships to develop an offer that aligns very closely with the local skills priorities".

MK College Group has led on a regional Local Skills Improvement Fund (LSIF) project which has contributed over £5m to supporting regional skills needs. Working with a group of Further Education Colleges in the region that represent almost 60,000 learners, they have come together to help bridge the skills gap.

As part of the project known as 'Delivering Skills, Boosting Business', the region will see new 'green technology' centres, brand new digital short courses, enhanced support for health and care sectors and a commitment to meeting and engaging with employers to continue to understand their evolving needs.

We know the transformational impact our exceptional teachers deliver; however we also know that inspiration can come from external experiences and competitions that bring to life learning. We call these 'wow' moments, which were highlighted and praised by Ofsted.

Aim Three


We achieve and maintain financial and operational sustainability that contributes to economic growth.

We know environmental sustainability is very important to our people – it is a key factor in attracting future colleagues and learners to Milton Keynes College. As we work towards carbon neutrality by 2030 through our installation of solar panels and an air source heat pump, we can also observe financial benefits from energy savings to attracting new investment.

In 2023 we engaged a consultant specialising in sustainability for the FE sector to produce a report on our performance and provide key recommendations for the way forward. Crucially, to ensure momentum is maintained as activities increase, we have invested in a Sustainability Lead who will spearhead our environmental initiatives. This supports our goal to achieve 'Leading' status on the FE Climate Action Roadmap by 2025/26.

Raising aspirations and improving prospects for our learners benefits them personally but also boosts the local economy. Our recent Ofsted report praised the College's collaborative working to develop the skills local people need to progress into further training, apprenticeships, or study.
